CITATION

Prof.Dr.S.Geethalakshmi,M.D.,Ph.D., is the Vice-Chancellor of the Tamil Nadu Dr.MGR Medical University, the second largest University of Health Sciences in India. She is the ninth and second woman Vice-Chancellor of the University of 25 years in existence.

After Post-Graduation, she pursued Ph.D. on Allergic Broncho Pulmonary Aspergillosis, from the alma mater, which she presides.

Dr.Geethalakshmi started from Assistant Professor and reached Professor & Director, Institute of Microbiology, MMC, spanning over 35 years. She accomplished multifaceted equilibrium of academic excellence in teaching and established her prudence in the post she occupied as Vice-Principal and Dean in-charge of MMC, and Dean of Thiruvannamalai Medical College, Kilpauk Medical College (KMC) and Stanley Medical College (SMC). The undeterred efforts as Dean, adjudged the MMC and KMC as best Medical Colleges in South by India Today and Outlook in the years 2009-2013.

The distinguished administration at SMC and KMC, elevated her to the post of the Director of Medical Education (DME) in Tamil Nadu in 2011.

The role of DME had provided an opportunity, even with limited parameters and infrastructure, she had uplifted the Medical Education through the establishment of new medical colleges, by giving opportunities to the students of Under-graduate and Post-graduate in pursuing their professional course. Adequate infrastructure was ensured to develop tertiary care hospitals. Superspeciality and new Post-graduate courses were started in different disciplines in the Medical colleges, in addition to increase in intake in UG and PG seats. More than 70,000 medical camps were conducted. Starting of Breast Milk Bank in Government Hospitals and DM Neonatology, led to decline in infant mortality rate.

The Best Teacher was awarded by the Tamil Nadu Medical Council in 2014. The passion towards teaching never deters her to develop proximity to the social needs.

During her Directorship, she raised high to the tragedy that took place in 2014 at Mugalivakkam, Porur, a Chennai suburb where, a skyscraper building caved in due to sudden heavy downpour which led to the death of nearly 60 construction labourers. The organized relief efforts made by Dr.Geetha-lakshmi in ferrying affected labourers to hospital in ambulance and stationing a Medical Team full time at the devastated venue led to decline in death rate. The outstanding caliber exhibited by the DME, earned “Award of Effective Management of Rescue Operations” by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu.

Dr.Geethalakshmi was the key person in delivering health care relief materials to the people of Chennai during unprecedented rains and floods in October to December 2015, and thus controlling the disease epidemic in the State. Spread of water-borne, mosquito borne diseases especially Dengue was curtailed due to her persistent efforts at disinfecting Chennai and its suburbs. She consolidated the efforts of men with matching power and brought resilience in the disturbed minds of the citizens.

The awards and accolades encouraged her to march towards the goals ahead of her. The Indian Association of Medical Microbiology, presented her with Life Time Achievement Award in 2015 for her contribution to Microbiology. For her yeoman service to the field of Medical Profession, she was presented with Life-time Achievement Award by M.V.Hospital for Diabetes & Prof.M.Viswanathan Diabetes Research Centre, in 2016.

Dr.S.Geethalakshmi, within eighteen months of assumption of the post of Vice-Chancellor, she aims to bring this University to greater heights on par with international standards in terms of curriculum, academic, development, research, collaborations with National and International Universities, exchange of faculty and students at home and abroad. The societal concern invokes her to bring certain services in this University for the development of society.

Keeping pace with fast changing world, the University had introduced Digitalization in the administration and education for better accuracy and fast disposal. Online Medical courses are also on pipeline, and some of them have reached the level of signing of MoUs with foreign Universities. For the benefit of students in the society with less affordability, the University introduced new Allied Health Science Paramedical courses with cost effective and to face the competitive world.

She has been serving as Chairperson of the Selection Committee of Faculty at JIPMER, Puducherry. She published several Research papers in National and International Journals.

The concepts and innovative thoughts of Dr.Geethalakshmi have been taken and implemented by the Government of Tamil Nadu in terms of Medical Education and medical care to the people of Tamil Nadu.

The outstanding laurels she had achieved in her medical field, earned the Prestigious Dr. B.C. ROY NATIONAL AWARD in 2016.

She undertook laborious task in achieving NABL Accreditation to HIV testing laboratory and established modern Microbiology and PCR Laboratory, with cutting edge technologies in Blood Culture, Microscopy at MMC. As Principal Investigator for ICMR projects and INCLEN, she worked meticulously on projects - Biomedical Safe Injection Practices and Influenza in Paediatric population and Intradermal Rabies Vaccine.

She underwent training for safe Laboratory Practices at Johannesburg, South Africa by CDC through NACO. In 2015, Dr.Geethalakshmi was the key person in delivering health care and controlling disease epidemics during unprecedented floods in Chennai. In 2016, a seminar on Valuing the Human Capital was organized on personal and team development programme with the underpinnings of Organizational Psychological Medicine. - first of its kind in India.

She had introduced Digitalization in University administration and education, like On-Screen Evaluation system and separate portal for Evaluation and submission of thesis to improve quality and transparency. The Medical Council of India conferred Dr.B.C.ROY NATIONAL AWARD in 2016 for her unflinching service to medical field and society.

The contribution and her service spanning over 35 years by Prof.Dr.Geethalakshmi to the field of Microbiology had brought well knowledgeable Post graduates and Research Scholars, who were placed under her guidance.

With an unblemished record, the contribution as Dean proved in terms of establishment of laboratories for quicker results with specific reference to MRI and CT scans, etc. The Breast Milk Bank and Neonatal units, she established at Government Medical Colleges and hospitals, led to decline in infant mortality rate.

The diagnosis of Mycotic diseases is the main research contribution in areas related to Mycotic serology and immunology, epidemiology of Mycotic diseases. Medical Colleges, she showed keen interest in providing effective health care delivery to the people of mass, who are unprivileged, oppressed and marginalized.

In 2014, at Mugalivakkam, Porur, a Chennai suburb, a skyrise building caved in, due to sudden heavy downpour, brought the building to rubble in no seconds, which led to the death of nearly 60 construction labourers. The efforts made by Dr.Geethalakshmi, despite torrential and incessant rains, made all relief efforts in ferrying affected labourers to the hospital through ambulance saved many lives.

The unprecedented rains devastated the Chennai city from October to December 2015 that kept the people in closed door. She took great efforts in organizing more than 70,000 medical relief camps for the stranded and homeless people. Spread of water-borne, mosquito borne diseases, especially Dengue was curtailed due to her persistent efforts at disinfecting Chennai and its suburbs.

Govt Med Colleges to be Video-linked

Chennai: As part of the ongoing measures to implement web-based health information and management systems, government medical colleges in the State will soon have video-based services.

These services will thus help in management and knowledge-sharing across institutions.

Officials at the Directorate of Medical Education (DME) said the videoconferencing and telemedicine system will interlink 15 government medical college hospitals and the process, which is part of the health management information system project, is being expedited by holding consultations with the State government.

Already, both patient and

employee information are being digitised across all government hospitals in the State under the HMIS project in three phases.

Now, with videoconferencing, official meetings can be conducted online across the State at one go, while telemedicine will help students, professors and medical experts to exchange ideas and view complex live surgeries and recorded videos as well.

For this purpose, the high-speed connectivity provided to medical institutions under the National Knowledge

Network, a state-of-the-art multi-gigabit network provided to all knowledge-related institutions, will be utilised.

Railtel, that provides communication and IT services to Indian Railways, is

the service provider for NKN, which will now be used for video streaming.

Apart from that, other infrastructure required for the system to be in place, including computer systems and high-definition video cameras, would be procured, the officials said.

"Whenever there is an issue or need, conversations with the deans of medical colleges are done over the phone.

But with videoconferencing, officials can be made to understand that a particular issue has to be given top priority. Since HMIS is being implemented in different phases, efforts are being made to expedite this particular process by holding consultations with the government," said Dr S Geethalakshmi, the Director of Medical Education.

Research units at medical colleges

To promote research among students, a multi-disciplinary research unit will soon be set up in Madras Medical College and Tirunelveli Medical College, informed director of medical education Dr S. Geethalakshmi.

Speaking on the sidelines of the national conference held for the first time at the erstwhile assembly hall-turned medical conference hall at TN multi-speciality hospital on Omandur Estate on Saturday, she said plans were also afoot to set up such research units at medical colleges in Coimbatore and Madurai.

"The unit will have lab facilities, manpower and materials needed for research. Financial grant will be provided for the research," she said. Also, rheumatology departments will be established at Stanley medical college and government medical colleges in Madurai, Tirunelveli and Salem.

rheumatologists and students participated. The CME was to create awareness among people about lupus, an autoimmune disease. Dr Rajeshwari, head, rheumatology of Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, said there was no cure for

this disease but one can manage and control lupus. Rheumatologist Dr B.G. Dharmanand from Bengaluru said patients approach with multisystem presentations, fever of unknown origin, polyarthrititis among others.

"Less than one per cent of population is affected by lupus and it is seen more among young women in reproductive age. If we don't diagnose at its early stage, it leads to mortality and morbidity," said Dr Panchapakes Rajendran.
